Where is the program taking place?

Most part of activities will take place at Unilasalle Campus Beauvais. We will be also staying one day at Unilasalle Campus Rouen.

The "Institut Polytechnique LaSalle Beauvais" is the result of a merger between two graduate schools: the "Institut Supérieur d'Agriculture de Beauvais" (ISAB) and the "Institut Géologique Albertde-Lapparent" (IGAL). The main focus of the institution is on Earth, Life and Environmental Sciences. Founded in 1854, the institution has now approximately 1,600 French and international students, 200 employees, 90 professors (teaching and research), 280 stand-in teachers, and 5,600 Alumni. LaSalle Beauvais is located in the Picardie region, 50 miles to the north of Paris. True to its founding principles, after Jean-Baptiste de La Salle (17th Century), LaSalle Beauvais shares the responsibility and mission of all LaSallian institutions in the world, to serve in a global society: fighting poverty through education and training, and promoting widespread sharing of knowledge.

What to pack

The residence at La Salle Beauvais provides bedclothes (sheets, pillowcases and pillows) as well as towels. It is recommended that you either pack your own toiletries for the conference or plan on buying them upon arrival.

Conference workshop attire will be mostly casual. There will be some events spent off campus, but for the most part, you should dress as though it were a normal day at your home university. On the weekend we will be in Paris, and you will have free time that you can spend touring. So please pack with that in mind as well.

For workshops or group work, you should pack as you normally would for a day at your home university – notebook, pen, pencil, etc. It is also recommended that you bring a USB Memory Drive for presentations.

- Weather in North of France: 15°C to 30°C on summer
